Introduction:

The Edmonton and District Kart Racing Association (EDKRA) would like to thank you for joining our club and would like to wish you all the best in the upcoming season. These supplementary regulations are meant to be read in conjunction with the ASN Canada FIA (ASN) Canadian Karting Sporting and Technical Regulations.

EDKRA uses e-mail and their website as much as possible to communicate with its membership. If you do not use e-mail, contact the Secretary to be put on a mailing/phone list. The best way to stay up-to-date with club news and activities is to log on to www.edkra.ca and attend meetings the second Tuesday of the month (check the website or contact an EDKRA board member for meeting location).

EDKRA is an ASN affiliated club, with ASN as its sanctioning body. EDKRA race days are governed by the ASN Canadian Karting Sporting and Technical Regulations and these EDKRA Supplementary Regulations. The ASN Canadian Karting Sporting and Technical Regulations are available at www.asncanada.com or from the Provincial ASN liaison. In addition to these national regulations, these EDKRA supplementary rules, regulations and procedures have been adopted for local club racing events. The EDKRA Supplementary Regulations have been reviewed by ASN for local club racing.

Race-Day Schedule

The following schedule of events is for **club championship** races. Updates will also be posted to EDKRA's website. Event Supplementary Regulations should also be reviewed prior to participating in any special race events.

8:30 AM	<u>Gates Open</u>
9:00 - 10:00	<u>Registration</u>
9:15 - 10:00	<u>Safety Pre-tech Inspection</u> All drivers, karts and safety equipment must pass pre-tech-inspection. Failure to do so will result in the kart not being allowed on the track.
9:45	<u>Drivers' Meeting</u> All drivers must attend. There is no running of engines allowed in the pits.
10:00	<u>Race Director Opens Track for Practice</u> A running order for the practice sessions will be posted each race day.
10:00 -12:00	<u>2 sessions of practice</u>
12:00 -12:30	<u>Lunch Break</u>
12:30 - 1:45	<u>1st Pre-final 50% points awarded</u>
1:45 - 2:00	<u>15 minute break</u>
2:00 - 3:15	<u>2nd Pre- final 50% points awarded</u>
3:15 - 3:30	<u>15 minute break</u>
3:30	<u>Finals 100% points plus the two pre-finals</u>

EDKRA reserves the right to amend this schedule due to rain or other unanticipated factors.

In order to facilitate a more efficient race day, not all of the recognized club classes will be able to be on the track by themselves. Grids may be combined.

Possible examples of combined grids (assuming no conflicts in registration) include:

- Junior 1 Honda with Junior 2 Honda (last choice)
- Junior 2 Honda with Senior Honda

The Race Director, Clerk of the Course and Steward have the authority to change grids.

Each year EDKRA recognizes certain classes according to their participation level the preceding year. Following are the classes for the 2010 race season.

Outlaw 4 Stroke engine rules

1mm over bore max

14cc combustion chamber Min

201 cc engine volume

Honda GX/Clone 160/200 cylinder heads only

27.5 mm intake valve – 25 mm exhaust valve size maximum

Camshaft 270 lift - 260 duration maximum

Carburetor – 24 mm max, brand open

Ignition module stock Honda or clone only

Exhaust pipe-open, but must comply with ASN muffler/bumper rules

All else engine related will be deemed non tech (open)

Examples rocker arms and ratios, connecting rod, pistons, valve springs, pushrods carb adaptors(intake manifold), headwork, clutch, etc & etc all open.

General Rules

Under no circumstances are any volunteers, officials or track personnel to be abused in any way. No drivers or crew are to engage in any conflict period! All concerns, disputes or protests must be voiced to the Race Director and/or President in the form of a quiet and polite discussion or in writing as per ASN regulations. All persons involved in any conflict or found verbally or physically abusing any other person will be banned from racing. Drivers are responsible for their crews. EDKRA will not tolerate or be lenient when dealing with misconduct.

Any person caught cheating or using illegal parts, in any manner, shape or form, will be disqualified and will be subject to discipline by the Race Director and EDKRA Executive. Loss of all club points, fines and/or suspensions will be determined on a per incident basis. The ASN technical regulations and policies will be enforced.

No hitting or contact between karts will be tolerated. The Race Director has sole discretion to assess penalties for on-track incidents. All drivers must understand and obey flags at all stations at all times. Competitors are required to acknowledge flag signals at all times. Bump drafting will be allowed on straight sections only. Any driver overtaking another driver must do so cleanly and without contact. Drivers being overtaken must not block, but are entitled to the racing line. Drivers being overtaken/passed must allow racing room/space when a fellow driver is or has pulled up beside their kart. Blocking, passing unsafely or knocking another driver out of the way and gaining a position will result in a penalty. All incidents must be reported to the Race Director. The warning flag will be used rather than the black flag in most cases. A driver shown the warning flag can continue the race, but must report to the Race Director immediately following the heat. The Race Director reserves the right to penalize the driver after the completion of the race. If you have received a black flag and your number has been displayed, you must report to the Race Director. The scale operator may also request that you see the Race Director.

Revision to ASN rule 19.3(a)

Protest fee is reduced to \$50 which must be submitted at the time of protest and is non refundable.

EDKRA Supplementary Regulations

These regulations are supplementary to the current ASN Canadian Karting Sporting and Technical Regulations. As per rule 1.3 d) and 9.1 a) with the approval of ASN, these club regulations take precedence, but must always be read in conjunction with the ASN Canadian Karting Sporting and Technical Regulations.

Rule Updates

Updates shall come into effect when published in newsletters, made available at registration, published on the club website at www.edkra.ca, or issued with Event Supplementary Regulations.

- 1 It is mandatory for all Junior racers to wear a Helmut cushion (neck collar).
- 2 EDKRA highly recommends that all Jr. 1 parents purchase rib protection with “approved” CIK Chest plate protection.
- 3 The organizer will ensure suitable scales are used. The scales will be available throughout the event, when not in use to check karts as they come off the track. In order to protect the accuracy of the club’s scales on race day, all racers must come to a stop and shut off their engines a minimum of three feet before the ramps to the scale. Following this, they may push or be pushed on to the scales. Anyone who drives on to the ramps may be subject to a financial penalty. Failure to pay the fine will result in disqualification for the event.
- 4 Note: there is to be **no passing** after the checkered flag as there is no manual backup scoring system in place. Drivers are to line up at the scales in the order they finished the race so that any necessary adjustments can be made. Deliberate passing after the checkered is subject to penalty.
- 5 The official notice board should be checked for Event Supplementary Regulation qualifying procedures updates. Qualifying will normally be a five-minute session for each class, with competitors leaving the grid in an order based on a pea pick. The pea pick is for qualifying order only — pre-final grids will be determined by qualifying times. Large classes may be divided into two groups for qualifying, with 1st, 3rd, 5th ... pea pick in the first group and 2nd, 4th, 6th... in the second group.
- 6 If a driver stops during qualifying they may restart.
- 7 When a race is red flagged, the normal procedure will be for competitors to drive very slowly and cautiously, stopping in a single file line that is a minimum of six feet before the start/finish line. **No passing is allowed.** Competitors must be prepared to stop at the side of the track out of the way of any accident scene.
- 8 Fuel – the 4-stroke engines & the 2-stroke engines are required to use Premium Gas at

this time from a station of drivers choice.

Technical Inspection

- 1 EDKRA uses the ASN Pre-Technical Inspection Self Declaration form. This form is given to the Tech Inspector during Inspection.
- 2 At Club Races Only, EDKRA allows old style body work (all karts must be equipped with plastic side pods, nose cone and steering column fairing).

Club Points

- 1 Each racer will receive points equal to the total number of EDKRA entrants in the class plus: Heat 1 50% points plus Heat 2 50% points plus final 100% points for the total event.
- 2 1st 200, 2nd 175, 3rd 155, 4th 140, 5th 130, 6th 120, 7th 110, 8th 100, 9th 90, 10th 80, 11th 75, 12th 70, 13th 65, 14th 60, 15th 55, 16th 50, 17th 45, 18th 40, 19th 35, 20th 30, 21st 28, 22nd 26, 23rd 24, 24th 22, 25th 20, 26th 18, 27th 16, 28th 14, 29th 12, 30th 10, 31st 8, 32nd 6, 33rd 4, 34th 2, 35th 0
- 3 For club events, only EDKRA members will be allowed to use the points earned towards the club championship. However, non-members are eligible to receive trophies.
- 4 Points will be awarded as though non-members were not entered. For example, if the highest place club member finishes 3rd in a 10 kart field where two non-members finish 1st and 2nd, the 3rd place club member will earn 208 (1st place) points plus heat awarded points towards the club championship.

Membership

- 1 Entrants who live in the Edmonton region will be required to be EDKRA members in order to race. Entrants from outside the Edmonton area must demonstrate that they have a valid ASN Kart Club membership or they will be required to join the Edmonton Club.
